#### STALLED FAITH?

Dear Family,

I have been blessed to be able to acquire my pilot's license. Unfortunately, for a variety of reasons, I cannot fly any longer, but I am forever thankful for the time that I did. When one begins flight instruction one of the maneuvers that must mastered is how to recover from a stall. There are a couple of types of stalls. One is a power off stall. This is not when the engine stops running as the name may at first imply. When any stall occurs, the wing stops producing lift. This happens when the wing is beyond what is called the critical angle of attack. To explain this, stick your hand out the window of your car like a wing and tilt your hand so that the wind hits more of the palm of your hand. The angle at which your hand is hitting the wind is the angle of attack. When a stall occurs, the wing of an airplane hits the wind too steeply. When this happens, the wind no longer flows smoothly over the wing and the wing can longer produce lift. At that point the plane begins to drop. A pilot has to learn to identify the warning signs of a stall and know how to recover from one quickly should one occur.

When a plane enters into a power off stall the very first thing the pilot must do is to push the nose of the plane over and point it downward. Counterintuitive yes, but you must put the nose down. This decreases the angle of attack. At the same time, the pilot needs to apply full throttle. This helps you to build necessary air speed over the wings. While this is going on, the pilot must use the rudder pedals to keep the tail following the nose of the plane. Those among other things are necessary to recover when an airplane stalls.

What if our faith stalls? Well, same things. First, put your nose down. As the saying goes, "keep your nose to the grindstone". Recovery from a stall in faith will require our determination to want to recover. This may require us to make ourselves uncomfortable, not unlike pointing the nose of a falling airplane toward the very ground you're trying to avoid.

Second, the pilot must apply full power. He has to give it everything the engine has. We, too, must give it everything we have. Even if we don't have everything it takes, God will make up the difference if only we do our part. Full throttle!

Third, while all the above is going on, the pilot must keep the body of the plane following the nose of the plane. He does this with the rudder pedals. At the point of a stall there is a lot of torque that can get the plane out of whack. So, the pilot has to keep the tail in line with the nose. The whole thing needs to be heading in the same direction. So, also, in faith, if we are heading toward God spiritually but heading away from God with our words and actions, we are not in a coordinated posture and we can crash.

The best way to recover from a stall is to never get into one in the first place. But, if it does happen, a pilot who follows the stall recovery procedure properly won't crash. Instead, he will start to gain momentum, put the nose on the horizon, and start to climb heavenward once again. Wind over the wings makes an airplane fly, the Wind of the Holy Spirit makes our souls fly...God raises up the humble.

I'll end with a bit of pilot wisdom...There are old pilots and there are bold pilots, but there are no old, bold pilots! Translated spiritually it means be humble and you won't crash! May your skies be blue and your winds calm.

Thank you! We have ended another successful year of Family Formation and CCD! Thank you to everyone involved in Family Formation: parents, catechists, speakers, child care and food preparation. Thank you to all our CCD catechists who prepare and teach the youth! A lot of effort and cooperation is involved in both programs and you are all appreciated!

Family Formation and CCD Registration for the 2024-2025 - We ask parents with children that will be in Kindergarten through 12th grade this fall fill out and submit with your payment the Registration forms located in the Narthex or on St Mary's website under Religious Education. We ask that you return them along with your payment by June 30, 2024 to get the early bird discount of \$10! After July 1st, there will be an additional \$10 late fee added.

CCD teacher needed for the fall of 2024: We ask that you continue to keep our CCD and Family Formation programs in your prayers.
